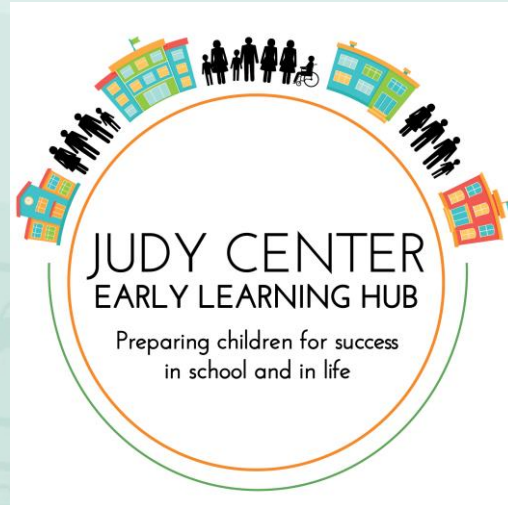

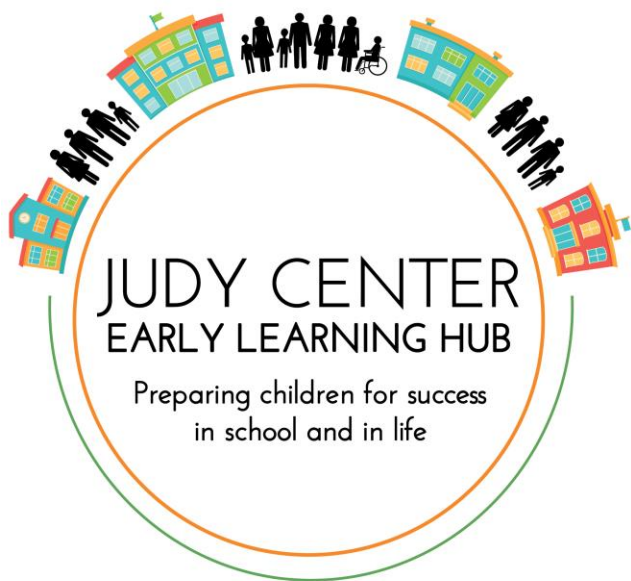

- Trauma, Changes during COVID the new norm for children to understand.

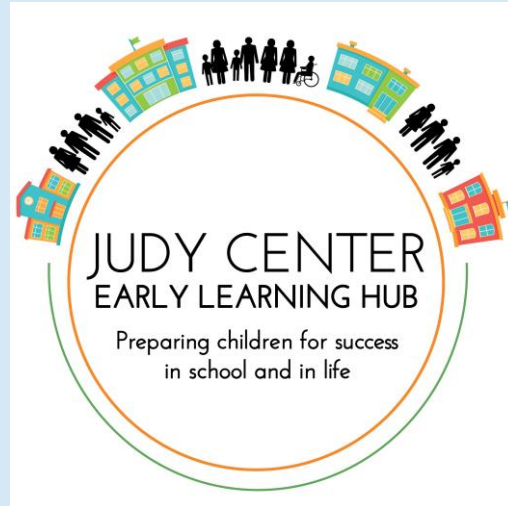
